

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITION OF
3.3 FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS TO ADRC**

TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

1 WHEREAS, the services provided by the Aging and Disability Resource Center are critically
2 important to the older and disabled adults of Manitowoc County; and

3
4 WHEREAS funding in the 2011 budget allows for the addition of one full-time Information
5 and Assistance Specialist; and

6
7 WHEREAS, the demand for the services exceeds the available hours of service; and

8
9 WHEREAS, the Manitowoc County Board of Supervisors has authorized creation of the
10 ADRC of the Lakeshore to collaboratively provide ADRC services to the citizens of Manitowoc and
11 Kewaunee Counties; and

12
13 WHEREAS, two additional Information and Assistance Specialists and an additional 0.3 FTE
14 Disability Benefit Specialist will be required as a result of the creation of the ADRC of the
15 Lakeshore; and

16
17 WHEREAS, funding generated from the services provided to Kewaunee County residents
18 under the ADRC of the Lakeshore Agreement will pay for the costs of the additional staff needed
19 to provide the services required by the agreement;

20
21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the number of authorized positions for the
22 Aging and Disability Resource Center be increased by 3.3 full time equivalent positions; and

23
24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that one full-time Information and Assistance Specialist may
25 be hired immediately; and

26
27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Current Disability Benefit Specialist be increased from
28 .7 FTE to 1.0 FTE and 2.0 FTE Information and Assistance Specialists be hired when the ADRC
29 of the Lakeshore Agreement becomes effective; and

30
31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the current Disability Benefit Specialist be made full-time
32 and the Information and Assistance Specialist positions be filled in accordance with the Employee
33 Policy Manual; and

34
35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Comptroller/Auditor is directed to record such
36 information in the official books of the County for the year ending December 31, 2011 as may be
37 required.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACT WITH CITY OF
APPLETON HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR PUBLIC HEALTH
EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PLANNING SERVICES**

TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1 WHEREAS, the Health Department is the official public health agency responsible for public
2 health emergency preparedness (PHEP) for Manitowoc County and receives grant funding from the
3 federal government for PHEP planning; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Manitowoc does not employ any PHEP planners and needs to purchase planning
6 services in order to successfully complete its PHEP grant objectives; and
7

8 WHEREAS, the City of Appleton employs staff that are trained and qualified to provide PHEP
9 planning services and is willing to provide the necessary planning services under a contract with
10 Manitowoc County; and
11

12 WHEREAS, Health Department staff and the Corporation Counsel have reviewed a proposed
13 contract and the Board of Health recommends that the county enter into a contract for Appleton to
14 provide planning services that are necessary to coordinate, implement, and document the public
15 health emergency preparedness activities required by the federal grants;
16

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Manitowoc County Board of Supervisors
18 authorizes the County Executive, County Clerk, and such other officials as may be necessary to sign
19 a contract with the City of Appleton Health Department for up to 19 days of service of public health
20 emergency preparedness planning services each fiscal year for a fee of \$7,000, with necessary travel
21 to be billed at the then current IRS mileage reimbursement rate.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT
TO PERFORM WORK EXCEEDING \$25,000
(Devils River State Recreation Trail)**

TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1 WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has enacted legislation providing matching grants for
2 development projects in governmental parks and recreation facilities; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Wisconsin Department of
5 Transportation, and the Manitowoc County Planning and Park Commission have determined that
6 development of the Devils River State Recreation Trail, a public recreational trail on an abandoned
7 railroad right-of-way in Manitowoc County, has a high priority; and
8

9 WHEREAS, the Department of Natural Resources has provided Manitowoc County with a
10 grant for 100% of the funding necessary to develop roughly 5 miles of the Devils River State
11 Recreation Trail; and
12

13 WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 59.52(29) provides that the county board may, by a three-fourths vote
14 of all of its members entitled to a seat, provide that a public work or any part of a public work may
15 be done directly by the county without submitting the work for bids; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the Highway Department has the ability to perform the work required on the
18 Devils River State Recreation Trail; and
19

20 WHEREAS, the Planning and Park Commission recommends that the Highway Department
21 be authorized to perform the work;
22

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Manitowoc County Board of Supervisors,
24 in accordance with Wis. Stats. 59.52(29), authorizes the Highway Department to perform the work
25 on the Devils River State Trail under the grant provided by the Department of Natural Resources
26 without submitting the work for bids; and
27

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Park Supervisor is authorized to sign all necessary
29 documents on behalf of the County of Manitowoc and to take the necessary steps to receive and
30 disburse funds under the grant and complete the work authorized; and
31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Manitowoc County will comply with state and federal
33 rules for the grant; will be responsible for updating plans and monitoring ongoing operations; will
34 obtain written approval from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources before making
35 changes in the project; and will maintain a record of expenditures; and
36

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that revenues in the 2011 budget are amended by the amount
38 of the grant, that expenditures in the 2011 budget are amended by an amount equal to the grant, and
39 that the Comptroller/Auditor is directed to record such information in the official books of the
40 County as may be required.

(Electronic Monitoring Program Fees)**

1 WHEREAS, Manitowoc County presently charges an electronic monitoring program fee that
2 is used to pay for the cost of the electronic monitoring program; and

4 WHEREAS, the Sheriff wishes to increase the electronic monitoring program one time
5 processing fee and daily participation fee that is used to support the program;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, the county board of supervisors of the county of Manitowoc does ordain
8 as follows:

10 The electronic monitoring program fee authorized by Manitowoc County Code sec.
11 4.13(3m)(b) one-time processing fee of \$40, tax included, is increased to \$50, tax included, for each
12 period of time that a prisoner participates in the electronic monitoring program; and

15 4.13(3m)(b) daily fee is increased from \$22 per day to \$25 per day.

**ORDINANCE REPEALING MANITOWOC COUNTY CODE § 6.22
AND AMENDING MANITOWOC COUNTY CODE § 14.07(3)**

TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1 WHEREAS, 2011 Wisconsin Act 35, the Concealed Carry Weapons Law, repealed existing
2 prohibitions against carrying concealed and dangerous weapons and authorized the Wisconsin
3 Department of Justice to issue licenses permitting qualified citizens to carry concealed weapons; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Manitowoc County Code sec. 6.22, which prohibits carrying a concealed weapon,
6 and Manitowoc County Code sec. 14.07(3), which pertains to firearms in county parks, contain
7 provisions that are inconsistent with changes to the Wisconsin Statutes that were enacted as part of
8 2011 Wisconsin Act 35 and that will become effective on November 1, 2011;
9

10 NOW, THEREFORE, the county board of supervisors of the county of Manitowoc does ordain
11 as follows:

12 Manitowoc County Code sec. 6.22 is repealed effective on November 1, 2011; and

13 Manitowoc County Code sec. 14.07(3) is amended to read as follows effective November 1,
14 2011:

- 15 (3) Firearms. Except as authorized by Wis. Stat. § 941.23, it is unlawful for any person to
16 have in his or her possession or under his or her control, any firearm or airgun as defined
17 in Wis. Stat. § 939.22, unless it is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case. No person
18 shall take, catch, kill, hunt, trap, pursue, or otherwise disturb any wild animals or birds
19 in any County Park or other areas under the supervision and control of the Commission.
